In 2013, the Strachan Foundation, together with a group of friends from Bain & Company, gave their financial support for the creation of INCAE's Strachan Chair of Philanthropy and Social Investment. Since its inception, the Chair has remained faithful to its mission of spreading the values of responsible leadership among INCAE students and alumni and those who direct the destiny of our region. Two objectives have guided our work:

- I. Educate current and future leaders in strategic social investment and philanthropy through research, case development, and technical notes, as well as through the design and teaching of modules for full-time MBA students, executive MBA students, and INCAE executive education programs.
- II. Inspire leaders and family groups to become protagonists of social investment and create a culture that encourages philanthropy



#### **Climate Change Congress**

As part of the Sustainability Foundations course, the Strachan Chair, together with the VIVA Idea Chair, organized the 2022 virtual Climate Change Congress for students of the MBA 2022 and Global MBA 2022 programs. The event took place in January.

During this event, 103 students directly interacted with important professionals from the public, private, and academic sectors. The special guests delved into various topics such as the role of the financial sector in climate change, opportunities for sustainable development, and green recovery after the pandemic, among others. The invited panelists were:

- Professor Gregory Unruh, expert in sustainable business strategy, George Mason University, USA
- Msc. Franklin Paniagua, former Vice Minister of Environment and Energy of Costa Rica
- MBA Henry González, Executive Director of the Green Climate Fund.



#### Special guest participation

Through the active participation of our special guests, we seek to provide our students with a first-hand experience of professionals who have successfully developed their careers in the region. Likewise, we seek special guests who can inspire students to follow their example and actively incorporate a social investment strategy into their professional development.

This year, we had the participation of MBA María Pía Robles, current Director of Corporate Relations at Florida Ice & Farm Co. in Costa Rica and a graduate of INCAE's Executive MBA program. In the session, María Pía shared with the students of the People and Organization II course the process of change she drove internally to update the company's Triple Bottom Line strategy to an ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) strategy. At the same time, the students had the opportunity to converse with the guest about the challenges of leading such a process and the strategic decisions to ensure that the organization's staff and managers integrate environmental, social, and governance practices into their daily operations.

#### Live case 1: Santa Eduviges

On July 1st, 60 Executive MBA students participated in a live case in which they listened, analyzed, and directly conversed with Mariano Vargas, Operations Manager of the Costa Rican company Beneficiadora Santa Eduviges. The case was presented by the protagonist and moderated by Professor Prado. The discussion revolved around the decisions Mariano had to make to confront the challenges posed by climate change. Specifically, decisions around increasing soil productivity, optimizing operations during the harvest period, and diversifying the markets served by the company were addressed. The general challenge of the case was to define strategies to ensure the sustainability of the business in the long term.

#### **Live case 2: ECOM Trading**

In December, we also had another INCAE graduate as the protagonist of a live case. On this occasion, María José Canales, who is the Binational Manager of ECOM Trading for Costa Rica and Nicaragua, shared a series of strategic and operational challenges with the students of the INCAE Executive Master's program.

This case revolved around the decisions that María José had to make in 2019, as part of the team that drove ECOM to become the first organization at the regional level to apply the Social Progress Index (SPI) at the company level. The students discussed and recommended how to prioritize social investment decisions based on data, how to leverage resources to finance ECOM's social investment, the strategy to expand the SPI methodology applied in Nicaragua to the more than 30 countries where ECOM operates, and finally, the communication methods that the company should follow to disseminate the results of social investment among its stakeholders.

Some of the main messages that Mr. Strachan expressed in his speech were:

- "...The purpose of the Lord for your life is like a rudder, it only works on a moving boat, and your job is to explore options, discover what is feasible and better for you, and trust that God and life have something better for you, but keep your boat moving..."
- "...Row towards situations where you can create the most value, and not necessarily the highest salaries..."
- "...Row with excellence in effort and execution..."
- "...Enjoy your life, travel, and if you are not happy, it may be that the universe is suggesting you consider a change of direction..."
- "...Even if you keep your boat moving and achieve social impact, it does not mean that you will escape adversity; you will make mistakes, some investments will fail"... "None of us escape adversity, but adversity is an opportunity to grow and reinvent yourself..."

#### Gerente de Impacto Podcast

In 2022, the Strachan Chair continued to share interviews with important business men and women from our region through the podcast "Impact Manager". In 2022, we reached more than three consecutive years on the air on various platforms, sharing experiences about the challenges and opportunities of making social investment in the region.

The podcast added 11 new episodes, adding more than 400 minutes of content. It reached a total of 2,600 downloads on platforms, and surpassed 10,000 total listens since its launch, registering listeners in 31 countries in the Americas, Europe, and Asia.

Gerente de Impacto not only seeks to inspire responsible leadership in the audience, but also to raise awareness about the value and challenges of making social investment in Latin America. #### **Management Consulting Project**

In 2022, thanks to the financial support of the Strachan Chair, two groups of INCAE MBA students carried out the Management Consulting Project (MCP) in important Central American impact organizations. The MCP consists of a consultancy carried out by groups of five MBA students in an organization as a final requirement to graduate from their master's program. The goal of the Strachan Chair in supporting these students is for them to have a transformative experience. The aim is for these groups to bring value to civil society organizations in the region, using the management knowledge acquired throughout their MBA at INCAE.

The organizations benefiting from the Strachan Chair were the Maya Instituto Tecnológico Maya de Estudios Superiores (ITMES) in Guatemala and Obras del Espíritu Santo in Costa Rica. These consultancies helped the organizations with marketing and promotion issues, as well as internal process improvement, respectively.

#### Visitas de grupos internacionales

During 2022, the Strachan Chair actively participated in classes, talks, and field visits with young professionals from high-renowned universities in the United States and Europe. The purpose of these visits was to allow the young professionals to learn about the way of doing business in Costa Rica and the Central American region. These visits were made possible thanks to Professor Prado, who, through her experience and network of contacts, facilitated the approach between students and executives with Costa Rican entrepreneurs, leading to an enriching exchange of experiences and contacts.

These were some of the international classes in which the Strachan Chair was present:

- Audencia Business School, France. The students worked with Professor Prado on a case study on the topic of climate change in the Costa Rican agricultural sector. Mr. Mariano Vargas, Operations Manager of the Santa Eduviges Beneficiadora, participated in the classroom session.
- Nyenrode Business University, Netherlands. For this visit, Professor Prado coordinated a series of talks
  with high-level speakers so that the students had the opportunity to learn about successful business cases
  in Costa Rica. Within the visits, highlights include participation from Zona Franca Coyol and DOKA Estate.
- New York University, United States. This visit brought together more than 50 students from the NYU executive program, who sought to learn about different productive sectors in Costa Rica and how to develop successful businesses in the country. This group shared a week with high-level speakers such as José Rafael Brenes, former director of the Costa Rican National Stock Exchange, and Mr. Carlos Wong, General Manager of Zona Franca Coyol, among others.
- Baylor University, United States. During this visit, students, along with members of the Baylor University faculty, experienced first-hand all the details surrounding the Costa Rican health system. The students visited an EBAIS and listened to a conference by Dr. Álvaro Salas, former executive president of the Costa Rican Social Security Fund, on the historical and macro environment of the country's health system. This session was held on the INCAE campus and moderated by Professor Prado.

For this event, the Strachan Chair provided partial sponsorship to four students to represent INCAE at Baylor University and compete with other universities from America, Europe, and Asia.

In addition to the financial support from the Strachan Chair, Professor Prado provided guidance to the students in solving the case they had to present. The competition theme this year focused on the question of how the hospital of the future can address the growing challenges of rural healthcare.

#### Participation of the Strachan Chair in International Conferences

As part of its efforts to promote its work, the Strachan Chair also actively participated in three internationally renowned conferences, where part of the material generated in the Chair was shown. These were:

**BALAS 2022 Annual Conference**. From June 10 to 13, this important conference was held in a hybrid format, where the Strachan Chair, represented by Professor Prado, presented a preliminary version of the case study "Santa Eduviges: a specialty coffee company" in a virtual session. This conference was held simultaneously inperson in Lisbon, Portugal.

**International Food and Agribusiness Management Association (IFAMA)**. From June 18 to 23, the Strachan Chair actively participated in this conference by sharing the draft of the case study "Santa Eduviges: a specialty coffee company" in a symposium session focused on teaching cases. Professor Prado and researcher Ignacio Sánchez participated in-person, sharing with other professionals in the agribusiness area at EARTH University.

- Forum: 2nd International Sustainability Forum. During this forum, Professor Prado met with specialists from Peru, Chile, and Colombia to discuss, from an academic, business, and consulting approach, the main challenges in terms of strategy, economics, and opportunities in sustainability.

#### Social Enterprise Knowledge Network (SEKN)

In 2022, through the Strachan Chair, INCAE continued to actively participate in the SEKN network, contributing efforts from research around the agenda of regenerative businesses in the region, as well as in leadership of administrative decision-making and group management.

Also, the Strachan Chair, along with other SEKN members, joined the Regenerative Food Businesses project, sponsored by the Avina Foundation, together with the support of organizations such as the International

Development Research Center (IDRC), Rafael Landivar University, and the Tropical Agricultural Research and Higher Education Center (CATIE).

In this project, the Strachan Chair applied as the principal investigator for the execution of an analysis protocol that seeks to study the regenerative business model in an organization in Nicaragua, which impacts the environment through its operations, but also generates social value by including small-scale agricultural producers in an international value chain as suppliers who ensure a level of quality.

SEKN is a network of Ibero-American universities that began operations in 2001 under the leadership of Professor James Austin of Harvard Business School and has since focused on the generation and dissemination of knowledge about social entrepreneurship in the region (www.sekn.org).
